

Through words on a page, action on a stage, garments on the body, or light across a set piece, you will be encouraged to explore all the ways that the visual, linguistic, and sonic language of theatre can be used to effectively tell a story.

Introduction to the Major

Theatre Arts encourages you to explore storytelling by pulling back the curtain and diving into the various dimensions of performance.

At Clark, we believe that a liberal-arts education is integral to the artist's process. In theatre arts you will engage in collaborative storytelling and world-building in a supportive liberal-arts environment that provides options for double majoring and offers a variety of areas of focus for your creativity. The program places a strong emphasis on live performances as both a teaching tool and form of artistic expression and inquiry.

CORE COURSES

We focus on creating fully immersive worlds on stage and page, collaborating with your peers in studio and fully staged productions, and honing your craft in courses in dance, acting, scenic arts, lighting, sound, costumes, and dramatic literature. As a theatre arts major you will take 14 courses including:

- Introductory classes in performance and analysis
- Five theatre arts courses specializing in a single area such as acting, directing, playwriting
- Three courses outside of theatre such as art history, photography, music
- Senior year capstone course

Meet like-minded peers by joining a student club like the Clark University Film Society, STIR Magazine, or the Clark University Player's Society.




Explore off campus

Practice storytelling and visual language

Since theatre is a way of communicating human experience, you learn both to read this language and to visually represent your own ideas. Training in theatrical methods and technical support is provided in the context of intellectual inquiry and critical analysis.
